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Hack & Hustle Announces Pilot Run of the Tech + Social Entrepreneurship Academy

The Hack & Hustle Social Entrepreneurship Academy is a workforce development program created through an equal partnership between Jecha Networks, Informative Technologies, and Hip Hop University. The program will increase economic mobility for underserved youth by placing scholars in technology training while providing them with face-to-face mentorship. The foundational concept for the Hack & Hustle Social Entrepreneurship Academy was conceived by Mr. Mahdi Chambers, President of Jecha Networks, Inc.

On July 10, the Hack & Hustle Leadership team will launch a two-week pilot program at the UNCC Portal Building, with approximately five to ten scholars. These Hack & Hustle scholars will learn to refurbish and transform eWaste computers into in-demand technology for community organizations. To accomplish this, Hack & Hustle will administer a mission-driven technology, entrepreneurship, & wellness training curriculum taught through the lens of Hip Hop Culture.

Scholars will learn critical technology skills such as computer hardware repair, software programming, solar energy, and digital literacy. They will also learn the value of mental wellness in connection to work-productivity through meditation and mindfulness training. Hack & Hustle will enable scholars to begin planning their own technology-based businesses with an underlying focus on engaging with and providing benefits to the community. With their newfound technical knowledge, scholars will help bridge the digital divide identified within their own neighborhoods.

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Teaching the Art of the Hip Hop Mindset through Hardware Recycling

Much like Hip Hop Culture is a mindset of resourcefulness and making something out of nothing, so too is recycling computer hardware. This is one skill Hack & Hustle scholars will take away from the first week of the pilot program.

This first week of the Hack & Hustle program will be led by James Walker, Founder and CEO of Informative Technologies Inc., and Gurtej Singh, Technology Director of the non-profit Hip Hop University. Informative Technologies, Inc. is a social enterprise that has researched and developed scalable, market-driven solutions to the digital divide and electronic waste since 2014. Utilizing Informative Technologies' refurbishing process, Hack & Hustle scholars will revive "obsolete" computers, allowing them to run better than ever; thus breaking the cycle of planned obsolescence so commonly built into competing operating systems today.

Hack & Hustle will follow the lessons of early Hip Hop pioneers, who revived old sounds and samples to create something new, vibrant, and long-lasting despite the systemic pressures compounded against them. Hack & Hustle scholars will harness technology to accomplish similar goals, uplifting and empowering themselves in the process.
